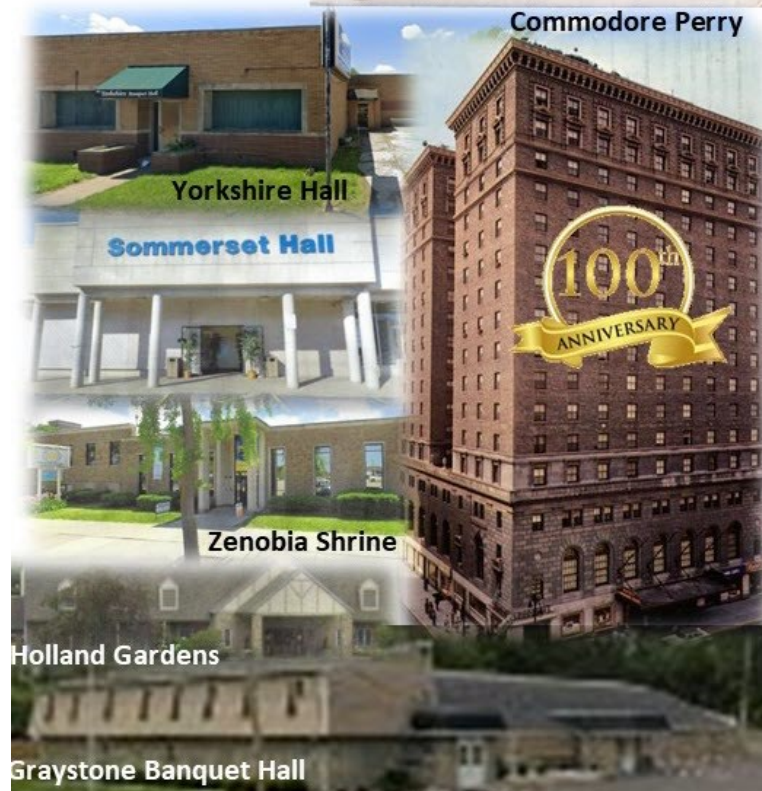

Pomeroy Philatelic Society

2024 marks the 138th anniversary of Toledo's first stamp club, the Pomeroy Philatelic Society, established May 6th, 1886. Successor clubs were the Toledo Philatelic Society, and present Stamp Collectors Club of Toledo. Pomeroy Philatelic Society was the second club to join American Philatelic Assn. (later American Philatelic Society) later that same year.

Stamp Collectors Club of Toledo Celebrates its 100TH Show.

On January 8, 1834, the first post office in the Toledo area was opened at Vistula, and a second at neighboring Port Lawrence near the mouth of the Maumee River. Faulty information caused a prior survey to show these two towns and an eight-mile-wide strip of land, including Maumee Bay, previously claimed by Ohio when attaining statehood in 1803, were now claimed by Michigan Territory. So... was Toledo to be in Ohio or Michigan?



Early covers, scarce to rare, show markings as being in Michigan Territory. Dave Plunkett, a long-time member, historian, and contributor to the Stamp Collectors Club of Toledo (SCCT) and editor of "The Ohio Postal History Journal", is showing an exhibit featuring some covers from the "Toledo Strip" and the resulting "Toledo War" at this show.

After much ado, including State Militias, Legislatures, Congress, The Supreme Court and President Jackson, "The Toledo War" was settled with no fatalities on December 14, 1836. Ohio retained "The Toledo Strip", Michigan was given the "Upper Peninsula" from land in the Northwest Territory and became a state in 1837. In that year Vistula and Port Lawrence joined to become Toledo.

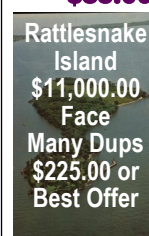
By 1886, some 40 years after the first U.S. stamp was issued, there existed thousands of stamp collectors, and that year saw the formation of the American Philatelic Society (APS). The Pomeroy Philatelic Society (PPS), predecessor to the Stamp Collectors Club of Toledo (SCCT) was also organized that year on May 5, and was the second club to become an APS affiliate. Meetings were held on the first and third Thursdays in the Adams Block (presumably the Courthouse Block building, built 1885).

This brings us to the question: "why Pomeroy Philatelic Society"?

Philatelists, especially those familiar with United States carrier and local stamps, will recognize the name Pomeroy as that of one of the New York express companies that issued private postage stamps. Founded by George Pomeroy, the company started in 1841, delivering packages, banknotes, and mail along a route from NY City to Albany via the Hudson River, then west along the Erie Canal to Buffalo and points west. At one point there was a Pomeroy office at the corner of Summit and Monroe Streets, a main intersection in downtown Toledo.

FIFTY YEARS OF BRIEF LOOKS INTO THE PAST

The Stamp Collectors Club has at times been called, the Toledo Philatelic Society and the Stamp Collectors Society. The Club was chartered in the 1920's and had meetings at various places. Karl Krantz, a life member and one of the Club's founders, had meetings in his father's office. Later in time the Y.M.C.A. housed many meetings. The Waldorf and Secor Hotels were also places of meetings. The Commodore Perry Motor Inn is now the home of "The Stamp Collectors Club of Toledo."

Many of the old members have gone. But members still recall names of early members such as Mr. Scott, Ed Jreska, Otto Meyer, John Wyatt, Fred MacGowan and many others who pursued the hobby of collecting stamps and enjoyed the fellowship that goes with it.

At one time it was customary to have dinner on the night before the show. Now a brunch is held on Sunday morning, including dealers, members and their wives.

Many of the children remember "Monty," Hugh Montgomery and his Packet Punchboard. We have endeavored over 50 years to educate, and offer fellowship to stamp collecting members of Toledo and the Northwest area.

The U.S. Post Office, of course, frowned on this, as Pomeroy was alleged to have provided a better service for less. Ultimately, Congress passed the Act of March 3, 1945, which made it illegal for private firms to deliver mail, citing the use of "post roads" and imposing crushing fines. Pomeroy had begun to shut down some ten months earlier in anticipation of the new law.

George Pomeroy, Sr. moved his family to Clinton, Michigan, and eventually, in 1863, relocated to Toledo building a successful real estate business. His son, George Jr. (November 28, 1848 – January 28, 1928), joined him and served twice as the President of the Toledo Real Estate Board and fourteen years on the Ohio State Board of Commerce. An 1888 list of members of the PPS included G.E. Pomeroy (Jr.).

Organized four months after George, Sr.'s death, it is believed that the Pomeroy Philatelic Society was likely named in his honor for his part in pioneering early postage stamps and the success of his express company (and the fact that his son was probably a founding member of the club.)

Over the years, the PPS suffered some growing pains, including breaks in regular meetings – mostly due to wars. In October 1886, the club joined the APS as affiliate #2. The 1895 minutes of the APS annual meeting list the PPS as 'Branch #9', organized August 14, 1894, signifying a lapse of at least a few years. A second break has been documented "toward the end of the century" (Spanish-American War?) but PPS was started again in 1915, just in time to be interrupted by The Great War (World War I).

The phoenix rose again as "The Toledo Philatelic Society" in 1920. Meetings began to be held at the Commodore Perry Hotel (pictured above) which was built in 1924 and is still standing on Jefferson Street. In 1939 the club's name was changed to its current "Stamp Collectors Club of Toledo (SCCT) to sound more "user-friendly" and "less stuffy". Meetings were curtailed at the start of World War II but picked up once more in 1945 and have continued to this day.

The first stamp show sponsored by the club was held at the Tri-State Fair in Toledo on September 5-10, 1887. Due to the interruptions mentioned, shows were not held every year.

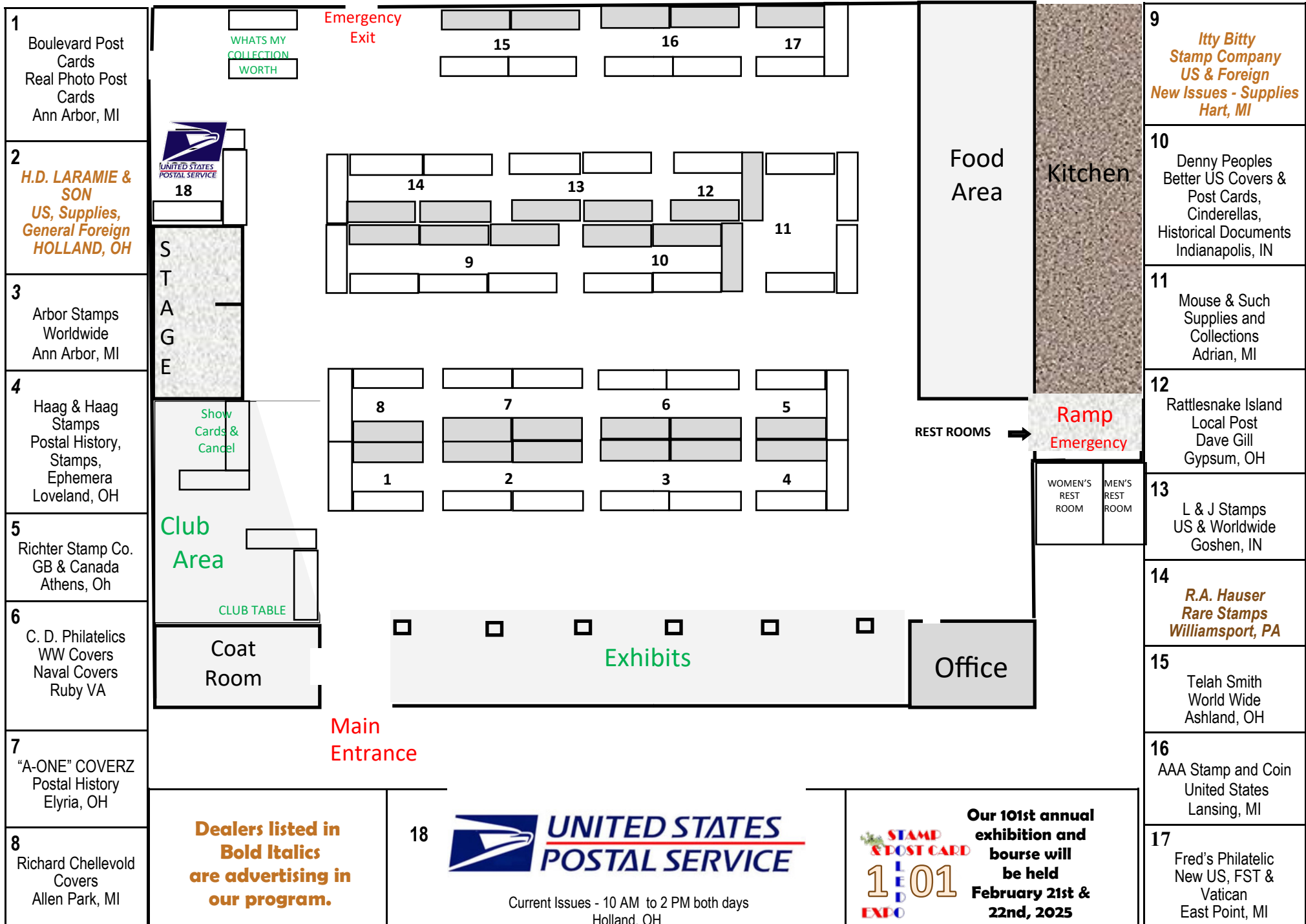
